1.5 Small and Medium Enterprise Participation

It is the policy of the Contracting Authority to promote participation by Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs) on a fair and equal basis.

SMEs are encouraged to explore the possibilities of forming relationships with other SMEs or with larger enterprises to meet the financial, economic or technical capacity requirements of the competition, if required.

Tenderers may include individuals, partnerships, limited companies, groupings or any combination of the foregoing with or without legal personality. However, a grouping if successful will be required to establish legal personality to enter the framework agreement / contract.

Tenderers are reminded that they may rely on the resources of other entities to establish the requirements on condition that they can prove to the satisfaction of the Contracting Authority that they will have these resources at their disposal when necessary.

If the tender is from a consortium / joint venture, tenderers must ensure that all the relevant information is provided and where necessary, provide the information requested separately for each party. Relevant information relates to where a tenderer is relying on the resources to qualify (e.g. turnover, personnel, previous experience) and/or to deliver contracts. The consortium must appoint a single point of contact who will assume overall responsibility for delivery, and who is authorised to sign the framework agreement / contract on behalf of all consortia members. The Contracting Authority will not act as an arbitrator between members of consortia.

2 ABOUT THE FRAMEWORK AGREEMENT

2.1 Type of Framework Agreement

The Contracting Authority invites tenders for the establishment of a multi-party framework agreement. The Framework Agreement will be established with one economic operator for each lot. Thereafter contracts will be awarded directly to the single framework member in the Lot concerned on foot of the original tenders or by consultation with the Framework Member and invitation to provide a supplementary tender within the constraints laid down in this tender documentation and the framework agreement terms and conditions.

A framework agreement constitutes a means of establishing overall terms and conditions in accordance with which, for a specified duration, individual contracts may or may not be awarded.

2.2 Overview of Requirements under the Framework Agreement

2.2.1 The Scope of the Framework Agreement

The objective of this CFT is to establish a framework agreement for the provision of Pest Control Services to Clare County Council with one single supplier appointed to each lot.

Clare Tourism DAC is a subsidiary of Clare County Council that operates seven tourism sites across the county that are collectively known as The Clare Collection. These seven tourism sites and their associated administration offices will also fall under the scope of the agreement.

Sites have been grouped into Lots.

Lot 1 = Clare County Council Sites

Lot 2 = Clare Tourism Sites

Please see Appendix 2A and Appendix 2B for more detail.

The successful tenderer for each lot will be required to provide pest control services on a planned and reactive basis in relation to the following: rodents (rats and mice), flies, insects, aphids and as necessary, birds and feral cats but not limited to these pests.

Rodenticides will only be permitted for use when absolutely necessary and must be applied in line with the 2019 regulations in Ireland regarding the use of rodenticides.

2.2.2 The Scope of the initial Call-Off Contract, if applicable

There is no guarantee of any orders being placed under this Framework Agreement, but where the need for pest control services arises, the Contracting Authority will consult the framework supplier in accordance with the rules of operation outlined in this Request for Tender.

2.2.3 Additional Call-Off Contracts under the Framework

There is no guarantee of additional contracts, but where they arise, the Contracting Authority will consult the member of the framework agreement in accordance with the rules of operation outlined in this Request for Tender. These are described in Section 3.

2.3 Anticipated Timeline

The following **indicative** timeline is envisaged for this procurement:

The dates provided above are estimates at the time of publication of the Request for Tender. The Contracting Authority will endeavour to run the process to this timetable, but this cannot be guaranteed.

2.4 Numbers admitted to the Framework

The framework agreement will be established as a multi-party framework agreement with one economic operator appointed to each lot, subject to that number meeting the minimum criteria and rules.

2.5 Duration of the Framework Agreement

The framework agreement will be for a maximum period of four years – an initial 24 month period with the option to extend for two further 12 month periods.

2.6 Estimated Value for the Framework Agreement

It is envisaged that maximum spend under this framework agreement will not exceed €216,000 excluding VAT.

It is emphasised, however, that this figure is provided strictly for indicative purposes only as there is no guaranteed expenditure under the framework agreement.

2.7 Awarding Contracts under the Framework Agreement

Contracts will be awarded directly to the single framework member in the Lot concerned on foot of the original tenders or by consultation with the Framework Member and invitation to provide a supplementary tender within the constraints laid down in this tender documentation and the framework agreement terms and conditions.

2.8 Right to tender outside of the Framework Agreement

The Contracting Authority intends to use the framework for the procurement of requirements falling within its scope during the specified period; however, it reserves the right to go outside the framework agreement for the procurement of any requirement without reference to the Framework Member(s). Admission to a framework agreement does not guarantee the award

of any contract to any economic operator, nor does it give the member(s) the right to be consulted in respect of, or tender for, any contract.

2.9 Compliance with the Framework Agreement Terms and Conditions

Admission to the framework agreement will be conditional upon acceptance of the Contracting Authority's Framework Terms and Conditions as appended at the relevant Appendix.

Tenderers are required to review these terms and conditions and indicate their acceptance thereof as part of their tender submission. Any reservation with regard to these terms should be submitted as a query in accordance with the procedure described in the Section below on Instructions for Tenderers.

2.10 Contract Terms and Conditions

In addition, tenderers should review the Contract Terms and Conditions which will apply to each discrete assignment under the framework, as appended at the relevant Appendix.

2.11 Award to Runner Up

If for any reason, it is not possible to admit to the framework agreement one or more of the tenderers invited following the conclusion of this competitive process, the Contracting Authority reserves the right to invite the next highest scoring tenderer(s) to join the framework agreement as appropriate, at any time during the tender validity period.

If, following the award of any contract under this framework agreement, the Framework Member cannot, for whatever reason, deliver the required services to the satisfaction of the Contracting Authority; the Contracting Authority reserves the right to award the contract to the next highest-ranked tenderer emerging from the process at any time during the contract tender validity period.

3 Detailed Specification of Requirements

3.1 Scope of Requirement under the Framework Agreement – Initial Call-Off Contract

For the purposes of this Competition, a pest is defined as an organism with characteristics that people see as damaging or unwanted. An animal can be a pest when it causes damage to an environment or poses a health risk. It is possible for an animal to be a pest in one setting but beneficial or domesticated in another (a “Pest”).

The following is a non-exhaustive list of types of Pests which are included in the scope of this tender for all lots

- Rodents
- Flying Insects
- Flies, Wasps, Bees, Moths
- Crawling Insects such as Ants, Cockroaches, Bed Bugs, Silverfish, Firebrats, Wood Worm, Booklice
- Feral Cats
- Birds including but not limited to Feral Pigeons

PLEASE NOTE THAT THE ABOVE LIST IS NON-EXHAUSTIVE AND THAT SPECIFIC PEST REQUIREMENTS MAY BE INCLUDED OVER TIME.

The framework agreement will be established on foot of this tender competition.

The following services will be required under this framework:

- 1) Provision & Maintenance of Pest Control Equipment (as required)
- 2) Routine Inspections on sites that engage in preventative pest control practices
- 3) Follow-up calls on sites where preventative pest control is in place and pest activity is detected
- 4) Emergency call out services – including out of hours services
- 5) Additional Services to include insecticidal treatment, removal of feral cats and birds and removal of bird droppings/animal fouling.
- 6) Development and implementation of pest control strategies, as required

Please note that the above list is non-exhaustive and that more specific pest control requirements may be included over time.

1) Provision & Maintenance of Pest Control Equipment (as required)

- Provide all sites that engage in preventative pest control processes with the necessary pest control devices, including but not limited to internal and external bait boxes, fly killing units and insect bait traps.
- Placement of pest control devices in appropriate locations with consideration to the nature of the business and being sensitive to the on-site interaction with the public.
- Routinely inspect all areas of the site.
- Submit regular reports to the Contracting Authority.

- Replace devices as and when required.

2) Routine Inspections

- Carry out routine inspections on sites that engage in preventative pest control processes.
- Submit reports detailing the findings on these routine inspections including but not limited to, any pest activity suspected or confirmed, devices requiring replacement or relocation, appropriate actions to be taken, timelines for the process.

3) Follow-up calls for sites engaged in preventative pest control processes

- If rodent activity is detected during a routine inspection visit, additional measures must be taken by the successful Contractor's technician to eliminate the pests as quickly and effectively as possible. These may include the use of rodenticides, subject to the 2019 regulations for use of rodenticides in Ireland;
- During the follow-up treatment, all actions taken, and all actions outstanding, will be recorded in a detailed inspection report, with a date for any further follow-up agreed with the Contracting Authority's representative;
- When and where additional baiting using rodenticides is required, this fact will be explained in the inspection report. All such extra baits such as rodenticides will be removed once the infestation has been eliminated
- In the event, that the presence of rodent droppings is noted in the monitoring stations or in the immediate area (i.e., within a one-metre radius), these droppings will be removed by the Contractor's technician. Any such action will be recorded in the relevant inspection report.

4) Emergency Callout Service

It is a minimum requirement that all requests for an emergency call-out will be actioned within 3 hours of acceptance of the call. The proposed action plan must be immediately detailed and agreed with the Contracting Authority's representative.

All emergency visits must be clearly recorded on an inspection report

The Contracting Authority reserves the right to seek alternative pest control services if the proposed action plan is deemed unsuitable by the Contracting Authority's representative.

5) Additional Services

Additional Services including but not limited to insecticidal treatment, removal of feral cats and birds and removal of bird droppings/animal fouling on an ad hoc basis

6) Development and Implementation of pest control strategies

The successful tenderer may be required to develop and implement appropriate, site specific, pest control strategies that are considerate to the environment, protect beneficial species and preserve local biodiversity.

The Successful Contractor shall:

- Ensure compliance with governing National and EU Pest control standards and best practice;
- Deliver consistent and efficient pest control services to the Client(s);
- Assist in reducing the overall cost of pest control for the Contracting Authority;
- For sites where preventative pest control is in place, monitor performance on at least a quarterly basis or more frequently as required and agreed with the Contracting Authority;
- Only use pesticides on site that are approved by the Department of Agriculture and in line with 2020 CRRU Best Practice Requirement regulations regarding the use of rodenticides. No pesticides will be stored on site.
- Ensure all pest carcasses, both rodent and insect, are disposed of correctly so as not to cause a Health & Safety risk or cause an environment risk such as secondary poisoning;

While recognising that these standards are not legislative or regulatory requirements for the provision of pest control services, the Contracting Authority recognises the following to be best practice:

- EN 16636, a European Standard in Pest Management Services;
- CRRU (The Campaign for Responsible Rodenticide Use) guidelines;
- Membership of an accrediting/regulatory body such as the IPCA, BPCA.
- ISO 14001, ISO 9000, OHSAS 18001

Rodenticides will only be permitted for use when absolutely necessary and must be applied in line with the DFAM-PRCD 2019 Regulations in Ireland regarding the use of rodenticides.

It is anticipated that all pest control services will be underpinned by certified quality standards, technology, robust policies and procedures which will, at all times, reflect good industry practice within an environment of continuous improvement. They should also be fully compliant with the use of rodenticides.

All staff engaged in installation and servicing on site must be fully trained in all operational and hygiene aspects of the work.

Lots

The competition is broken down into two lots.

- **Lot 1** = Clare County Council Sites
- **Lot 2** = Clare Tourism Sites

Within each lot there are various types of sites, including but not limited to, offices, canteens, sheds, farm buildings, castles, beaches. The locations in each lot are detailed in Appendix 2A and Appendix 2B. Pricing Document.

The larger sites will require a proactive approach, whilst in some smaller sites, there will be a requirement for reactive pest control on an “Emergency” basis only

3.2 Details of Additional Contracts under the Framework Agreement

3.4 Contract Management

The Contracting Authority requires tenderers to nominate a dedicated contract manager who will act as the main point of contact for the duration of the framework. This person shall have the authority to deal with all matters in relation to contracts and be responsible for the satisfactory delivery of the supplies/services required. The duties of the contract manager will include the following:

- Overall responsibility for a good working relationship with the Contracting Authority
- Provide regular reports on performance as agreed with the Contracting Authority
- Meet as and when required to review and examine performance in adherence to an agreed Service Level Agreement and Key Performance Indicators (KPIs);
- Deal with disputes, complaints or concerns that cannot be adequately resolved
- Proactively discuss with the Contracting Authority ways of improving efficiency regarding service delivery in general and providing suggestions for improvement and cost savings

NOTE: Tenderers will note that contract management activities will be non-billable.

4 SELECTION CRITERIA

The Contracting Authority is using the **Open** procedure for the award of this framework agreement, therefore, while all interested parties may submit a tender, only those demonstrating that they have the required level of financial and technical capacity will have their tender considered. In order to demonstrate a tenderers' qualifications, tenderers are required to provide the information set out below in the Tender Response Document (TRD) which is based on a self-declaration model, however tenderers are required to provide the minimum information required.

4.1 Use of the European Single Procurement Document

4.2 Relying on the Standing of Other Entities

Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs) are encouraged to explore the possibilities of forming relationships with other SMEs or with larger enterprises to meet the financial, economic or technical capacity requirements of the competition, if required.

Tenderers are reminded that they may rely on the resources of other entities in order to meet criteria and / or deliver elements of the contract requirements on condition that they can prove to the satisfaction of the client that they will have these resources at their disposal when necessary.

Therefore, a tenderer may consist of a grouping of any number of economic operators¹. Where a group come together in whatever form i.e. consortium, joint venture, subcontractors etc. to submit a Tender in response to this Request for Tender and regardless of the legal relationship between them, the Contracting Authority will deal with all matters relating to this competition through the entity (the "Lead Tenderer") who will carry overall responsibility for the performance of the contract only, if successful irrespective of whether or not tasks are to be performed by a subcontractor or other consortium member.

The Lead Tenderer must clearly and comprehensively set out the name, title, telephone number, postal address, and email address of the nominated contact personnel authorised to represent the tenderer and to whom all communications shall be directed and accepted until this competition has been completed or terminated. Correspondence from any other person (including from any subcontractor) will not be accepted or responded to.

All Lead Tenderers relying on the capacity of other entities must:

- Identify in the TRD as the Lead Tenderer for the grouping with whom the Contracting Authority will communicate and with whom any subsequent contractual arrangements will be made if successful.
- Identify in the TRD the relevant third parties upon whose capacity the Lead Tenderer is relying upon to meet selection criteria and / or deliver elements of the contract and identify the relevant criteria and elements of the contract.
- Ensure the TRD including all subsections are completed and submitted for all relevant third parties upon whom the Lead Tenderer is relying on to meet criteria and / or deliver elements of the contract if awarded.

¹ 'Economic operator' means any natural or legal person or public entity or group of such persons and / or entities, including any temporary association of undertakings, which offers the execution of works and / or a work, the supply of products or the provision of services on the market; (Art 2(10) of Directive 2014/24/EU).

- In all tenders, the Lead Tenderer must nominate the reference contracts for inclusion in the assessment and selection process. The number of reference contracts for which details are to be provided will be nominated in the TRD of the Lead Tenderer. If more reference contracts are provided than required only the first listed reference contracts to the number specified (e.g. 2 reference contracts) will be considered. Where relying on the experience of others, at least one of the references provided should include reference to their relevant experience.

Where the tenderer consists of a grouping of economic operators and the tenderer is subsequently successful at tender stage, the Contracting Authority may require the members of the tender grouping to enter into a formal arrangement that can support the provision of collateral warranties to the Contracting Authority for the group members' performance, etc. of the contract.

4.3 General, Legal and Financial Requirements

Tenderers are required to provide information on the following in the Tender Response Document. The criteria and rules outlined below are assessed on a pass/fail basis. Failure to comply with the requirements will result in the tender being considered inadmissible.

General Information

Provide contact and general information on the tendering organisation - company name, address and contact details for individual responsible for this tender and company overview as well as information on sub-contractors and consortium members if applicable. Please complete this section in the TRD.

Declarations

- Complete the Declaration of Bona Fides as per Art. 57 of Directive 2014/24/EU as implemented by SI 2814 of May 2016 as contained in the Tender Response Document.
- Complete the Declaration regarding compliance with relevant statutory obligations as contained in the Tender Response Document. Where tenderers are established and operating outside of Ireland compliance with equivalent legislation as applicable in the country of establishment / operation is required.
- The Contracting Authority may decide to examine tenders before verifying the absence of exclusion grounds in Regulation 57 of the regulations (the “Exclusion Grounds”) and the fulfilment of the Selection Criteria. However, notwithstanding anything contrary in this part 2.4, The Contracting Authority reserves the right to ask Tenderers at any moment during the Competition to submit any of the following for the purposes of verification of the status of the tenderer (including Prime Contractor and any Subcontractor).
 - (i) information concerning the Tenderer, and any proposed subcontractors, for the purposes of Regulation (EU) No 833/2014 (as amended by EU Regulation 2022/576 or any subsequent amendments to same) including, but not limited to, in respect of natural persons, copies of identity documents and, in respect of legal persons, a certificate or extract from the commercial register or other competent authority of the country in which the legal person is established.
 - (ii) and information concerning the origin of goods, if any, for the purposes of assessing compliance with Regulation (EU) No 833/2014 (as amended by EU Regulation 2022/576 or any subsequent amendments to same).
- If a Tenderer does not, upon request by the Contracting Authority, provide evidence which is considered by the Contracting Authority as sufficient to demonstrate (i) its fulfilment of the Selection Criteria (or any one of them) in accordance with this RFT and (ii) the absence of Exclusion Grounds, or its reliability despite the existence of a relevant Exclusion Ground and (iii) that it does not come within the category of prohibited economic operators identified in Regulation (EU) No 833/2014 of 31 July 2014 (as amended by EU Regulation 2022/576) and (iv) that the origin of goods, if any, are not subject to the prohibitions set out in Regulation (EU) No 833/2014 (as amended by EU Regulation 2022/576 or any subsequent amendments to same) then it shall be excluded from further participation in this Competition.

- If a Tenderer does not, upon request by the Contracting Authority, provide evidence which is considered by the Contracting Authority as sufficient to demonstrate (i) the fulfilment by any Subcontractor on whose capacity the Prime Contractor relies of the Selection Criteria (or any one of them) in accordance with this RFT and (ii) the absence of Exclusion Grounds in respect of any Subcontractor, or the reliability of any Subcontractor despite the existence of a relevant Exclusion Ground and (iii) that any proposed Subcontractor on whose capacity the Tenderer relies (where the value of that subcontract exceeds 10% of the value of the Services Contract) does not come within the category of prohibited economic operators identified in Regulation (EU) No 833/2014 of 31 July 2014 (as amended by EU Regulation 2022/576) then, it shall be excluded from further participation in this Competition unless it replaces the Subcontractor with one which meets all relevant requirements of this RFT.

Tenderers should ensure that they have submitted sufficient relevant information to allow their tenders to be assessed under each of the award criteria set out below.

The framework will be awarded on the basis of the most economically advantageous compliant tender taking into account the following award criteria and weightings. Tenderers should note that the qualitative award criteria are assessed first.

5.3 Post Tender Clarification

At the discretion of the Contracting Authority, tenderers may be invited, in writing, to clarify certain aspects of their tender, particularly where information or documentation to be submitted appears to be incomplete or erroneous. However, all such requests will be made in full compliance with the principles of equal treatment and transparency and avoid any distortion of competition.

5.4 Verification

Award of contract/membership of the framework may be subject to attendance at a verification meeting. It would be essential that the key personnel assigned to this framework should be available and present at this meeting. If required, tenderers will be notified of the date, time, agenda and format for such meetings as soon as possible.

A visit to the Tenderer's premises may be required to clarify any questions or queries regarding the tender offer.

5.5 Clarification of Abnormally Low Tenders

If the Contracting Authority considers the tender submission to be commercially unsustainable or otherwise problematic considering the tendered price or any other financial matter (including proposed indicative hours), the tenderer shall be invited to provide clarification to the Contracting Authority in respect of all elements of the tender submission that the Contracting Authority deems relevant. Any failure to satisfactorily comply with such a request, or to satisfactorily address the Contracting Authority's concerns, may, at the discretion of the Contracting Authority, result in the elimination of the tender in question on the basis of it being considered abnormally low.

5.6 Right to Confirm Suitability

Tenderers should note that the Contracting Authority reserves the right to confirm that the financial and technical capacity of the tenderer is valid and unchanged prior to the establishment of the framework and the award of any contract.

6 INSTRUCTIONS FOR TENDERERS

6.1 Submission of Tenders

The Contracting Authority is using the postbox facility on eTenders, and tender responses must be submitted electronically via the eTenders postbox facility on www.etenders.gov.ie only. Only tenders submitted to the electronic postbox will be accepted. Tenders submitted by any other means (including but not limited to by email, post or hand delivery) will **not** be accepted.

Tenderers must ensure that they give themselves enough time to upload and submit all required documentation before the closing date/time noting the use of the eTenders platform. Tenderers should consider the fact that upload speeds vary. In order to submit a response to the electronic post-box, please note that you must ensure you have submitted the response completely. It is advisable to familiarise yourself with the platform prior to the closing date.

Below we provide an overview of the key steps. Please note that the Contracting Authority take no responsibility for these steps being the totality of the steps required as different processes may require different actions.

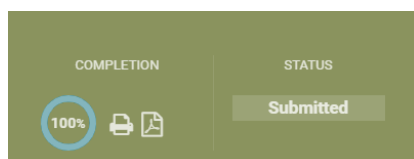
6.1.1 Accessing Documents

It is important to note that you must **ASSOCIATE** your company with this competition in the first instance. To do this you must do the following:

- (a) Log-in to the system
- (b) Locate the competition using the Advanced Search by Contracting Authority or Resource ID
- (c) Click on the hyperlink for the competition which will bring you to the CfT Workspace
- (d) In the Show CfT Menu for the competition click on the “Expression of Interest” in the drop down menu

6.1.2 Submitting your Response

Please note that the screen may say **OFFLINE**, this is a technical feature of etenders and does not mean you cannot submit. Also please note you may see the percentage field also saying 100% before you submit, this still requires you to go through the submit button.

Please upload your response as a **ZIP FILE** to protect the integrity of the file names.

It is the responsibility of the Tenderer to ensure that their tender is complete and is uploaded in accordance with the instructions provided on eTenders prior to the deadline as per the front page.

6.2 Closing date for Tenders

It is the responsibility of the tenderer to ensure that their tender is complete and is uploaded / submitted by the designated deadline. Tenders that are received late or via other means will not be considered in this public procurement competition.

6.3 Queries

All queries regarding this tender should be through the messaging facility on www.etenders.gov.ie, including any omissions which would prevent tenderers from submitting a comprehensive tender. Please submit queries as soon as possible and before the query closing date. The Contracting Authority is not obliged to respond to questions received after this date.

In circulating responses, queries will be edited to avoid disclosing the identity of the querist and will be circulated to all parties who have expressed an interest in the procurement on the eTenders website.

6.4 Extension of Tender Period

The Contracting Authority reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to extend the closing date for receipt of tenders by giving notice in writing (by post or electronic means) to all parties who have expressed an interest in the notice via eTenders no later than six days before the original closing date.

6.5 Tender Validity Period

To allow sufficient time for Tender assessment a Tender Validity period of 6 months is required, this period commencing on the closing date by which the Tenders are to be returned.

6.6 Discrepancies between Documents

A pdf version of the Request for Tender has been made available on eTenders. This document will be considered as the primary source document in this procurement process, word versions of documents where they are provided are being made available to assist

tenderers in responding to the tender competition. Where there is a discrepancy between a pdf version and a word version, the pdf version will take precedence. Tenderers are requested to notify the Contracting Authority immediately of any anomaly. Where applicable the Contracting Authority will issue amended versions.

6.7 Formatting of Tenders / Amending Tender Documents

Tenderers must ensure they use the Tender Response Document (TRD) when preparing their submission.

Tenderers are prohibited from amending any text or content of forms or declarations or templates provided as part of this tender competition in their tender responses. Where amendments have been identified, the Contracting Authority may at its discretion eliminate the tenderer from further consideration. Likewise, failure to use the template documentation provided particularly in relation to costing / pricing may result in tenders being eliminated.

6.8 Collusive Tendering

If any Tendering Party is found to have, at any time, offered to give or to have agreed to offer or give to any person, any bribe, gift, gratuity, commission or consideration of any kind as an inducement or reward for taking or forbearing to take any action in relation to the obtaining of its Tenders, or for showing or forbearing to show any favour or disfavour to any person in relation to its Tenders, the bid submitted by such Tendering Party shall be automatically disqualified and the circumstances surrounding such action shall be referred to the appropriate authority.

6.9 Confidentiality

After the official opening of Tenders, information relating to the examination, clarification, evaluation and comparison of Tenders and recommendations will not be disclosed to tenderers or other persons not officially concerned with such process until the award decision with the successful Tenderer has been announced and in conformity with national laws.

Tenderers shall treat the details of all documents supplied to them in connection with this contract as private and confidential and shall not disclose the contents to a third party without the permission of the Contracting Authority.

Any effort by the Tenderer to influence the Contracting Authority or their staff in the process of examination, clarification, evaluation and comparison of Tenders and in decisions concerning the award of the contract may result in the rejection of that Tender.

6.10 Clarification of Tenders

The Contracting Authority is entitled, but not obliged, to seek clarification of tenders, including pricing breakdowns in the course of the evaluation process. No change in the price or substance of the Tender shall be sought, offered or permitted. To assist in finalising the tender evaluation, selected tenderers may be invited to attend clarification meetings with the Contracting Authority.

Tenderers will be responsible for any costs incurred by them in the event that they are required to attend clarification or other meetings or make a presentation of their proposals.

6.11 Correction of errors

Detailed pricing of all tenders will be examined for errors that might alter the tender pricing as determined from the figures on the Form of Tender and electronic versions of the tender (if applicable). In general, the following approach will be applied to manifest errors - where there is a discrepancy between the unit price and the total amount derived from the multiplication of the unit price and the quantity, the unit price as quoted will normally govern.

The amount stated in the tender form will be adjusted by the Contracting Authority in accordance with the above procedure and, with the agreement of the tenderer, shall be considered as binding upon the tenderer. Without prejudice to the above, a tenderer not accepting the correction of their tender as outlined may have their tender rejected.

Where the Total Quote function has been activated on eTenders and a discrepancy arises between the amount in the Total Quote box and the tender submission, the amount in the tender submission shall take precedence.

Once the tender submission deadline has expired, no new information can be introduced. This includes cost elements.

6.12 Change in the composition of a Tenderer

Where a change in composition of a tenderer arises, this must be notified in writing to the Contracting Authority and formally approved by them. Where the original party to the tender was critical to the tenderer meeting some or all selection criteria, any replacement party must meet or exceed the same selection criteria standard.

The Contracting Authority reserves the right, but is not obliged, to disqualify any Tenderer that makes any change to its composition after submission of a Tender.

6.13 Interference and Inducement to Purchase

Any effort by the tenderer to unduly influence the Contracting Authority, relevant agency personnel or any other relevant persons or bodies in the process of examination, clarification, evaluation and comparison of tenders and in decisions concerning the Award of Contract shall have their tender rejected. The presumptions (including as to any gift, consideration or advantage) and other provisions under the Criminal Justice Act 2018, and all other measures for the time being governing the subject-matter in any applicable jurisdiction, shall be applicable.

6.14 Conflict of Interest

Any conflict of interest involving a tenderer (or tenderers in the event of a consortium bid) must be fully disclosed to the Contracting Authority. Any registrable interest involving the tenderer and the Contracting Authority or employees of the Contracting Authority or their relatives must be fully disclosed in the tender submission or should be communicated to the Contracting Authority immediately upon such information becoming known to the tenderer, in the event of this information only coming to their notice after the submission of a bid and prior to the award of the contract. Failure to disclose a conflict of interest may disqualify a tenderer or invalidate an award of contract, depending on when the conflict of interest comes to light.

6.15 Publicity

Tenderers shall not undertake (or permit to be undertaken) at any time, whether at this stage or after the award of the contract, any publicity activity with any section of the media in relation to this tender/agreement other than with the prior written consent of the Contracting Authority. Such consent shall extend to the content of any publicity. For the purposes of this paragraph, the word “media” includes (but is not limited to) radio, television, newspapers, trade and specialist press, the Internet and email, accessible by the public at large and the representatives of such media.

The Contracting Authority will have the right to publicise or otherwise disclose to any third-party information regarding this process and the agreement.

6.16 Right Not to Award

The Contracting Authority does not bind itself to accept the most economically advantageous tender or any tender. It also reserves the right to accept or reject in whole or in part any or all tenders received, and, in particular, to source the requirement with more than one provider.

The invitation to tender is issued in good faith; however, the Contracting Authority at its sole discretion shall not be obliged to award a contract or proceed to further stages in the procurement process and reserves the right to cancel the procurement process.

6.17 Notification of Tender Evaluations

All information regarding the evaluation process or potential outcomes shall remain confidential until after the conclusion of the tender process.

All tenderers will be informed of the outcome of their tenders following tender evaluation and any necessary clarifications.

Potential outcomes can be:

- Establishment of the Framework/Award of Contract
- Letter of Regret
- Decision not to proceed with the establishment of the Framework

6.18 Award Notices

Following the conclusion of the framework, an award notice will be dispatched to the eTenders announcing the results of the competition.

6.19 Policy on Personal Debriefings

Based on the provision of the information to unsuccessful tenderers as outlined above and due to resourcing constraints, the Contracting Authority will not be offering individual debriefing meetings to unsuccessful bidders.

6.20 Copyright

The Contracting Authority will have copyright ownership of any material developed for use by the Contracting Authority under the terms of this tender. The service provider may have a non-exclusive license to use such material but only for its own purposes (to be agreed with the successful tenderer).

6.21 Brand Names, etc.

Please note in relation to this tender document; where reference is made to a particular make, source, process, trademark, type or patent, that this is not to be regarded as a de facto requirement. In all such cases it should be understood that the reference in question is accompanied by the words "or equivalent".

6.22 Environmental Aspects

The Contracting Authority is committed to the principles of environmental management in its activities, and it encourages the implementation of sustainability principles in its procurement practices. Tenderers/contractors should make all reasonable efforts to minimise adverse environmental impact in the methods of service delivery and in materials used.

6.23 Knowledge and Skills Transfer

It will be a condition of the contract that opportunities for the transfer of skills and/or knowledge from the Tender/Tender's staff to the Contracting Authority staff will be availed of during the course of contracts under the framework agreement.

6.24 Currency and Payments

The currency in which all prices and rates shall be tendered, and which payments under the contract will be paid, shall be Euro (€). All prices and rates quoted should be exclusive of VAT, with the applicable rate of VAT clearly indicated.

A schedule of payments will be agreed with the successful tenderer and invoices shall be submitted in accordance with the terms agreed with the Contracting Authority.

6.25 Irish Legislation and Law

Tenderers should be aware that national legislation applies in other matters such as Employment, Working Hours, Official Secrets, Data Protection and Health and Safety. Tenderers must have regard to statutory terms relating to minimum pay and to legally binding industrial or sectoral agreements in the Contracting Authority tenders and in delivering contracts awarded to them. The contract(s) awarded on foot of this tender process will be governed by Irish law.

6.26 Anti-Competitive Conduct

Tenderers should take notice of the Competition Act 2002 (as amended, the "2002 Act"), which makes it a criminal offence for tenderers to collude on prices or any other aspects relating to this procurement competition.

6.27 Accessibility / Dignity at Work

The successful tenderer(s) shall comply with all relevant legislation relating to dignity at work. As a public body and employer, the Contracting Authority is committed to a policy of equality of opportunity for all personnel.

In line with the Disability Act 2005, accessibility requirements should be clearly stated in request for tenders / quotations where applicable. Under Section 27 of the Act the Contracting Authority is required to ensure that both the goods supplied, and services provided to it are accessible to persons with disabilities.

6.28 Withholding Tax

Where applicable, payments shall be subject to Irish 'Professional Services Withholding Tax' at the prevailing rate (currently at 20%) as laid down by the Revenue Commissioners in Ireland. Non-residents may be able to reclaim such deducted Tax from the Office of the Revenue Commissioners in Ireland, International Claims Section located currently at Government Buildings, Nenagh, Co. Tipperary, Ireland (Tel: +353 (0) 67 63400).

6.29 Freedom of Information

All responses to this Request for Tender will be treated in confidence and no information contained therein will be communicated to any third party without the written permission of the tenderer except insofar as is specifically required for the consideration and evaluation of the response or as may be required under law, including the Freedom of Information Act 2014, EU and Irish Government Procurement Procedures, or in response to questions, debates or other parliamentary procedures in or of the Oireachtas (the Irish Parliament).

Tenderers are asked to consider if any of the information supplied by them in response to this request for tenders should not be disclosed because of its sensitivity. However, any blanket or all-encompassing request for exemption from disclosure is not acceptable; tenderers must identify explicitly any such information and give relevant reasons for considering it to be economically sensitive or confidential in nature. If this is the case, tenderers should specify the information that is sensitive and the reasons for its sensitivity. The Contracting Authority cannot guarantee that any information provided by tenderers, either in response to this tender or in the course of any contract awarded as a result thereof, will not be released pursuant to the Contracting Authority's obligations under law, including the Freedom of Information Act 2014, or to those under EU and Irish Government Procurement rules. The Contracting Authority accepts no liability whatsoever in respect of any information provided which is subsequently released, or in respect of any consequential damage suffered as a result of such disclosure.

6.30 Late Payment

The Contracting Authority operates in accordance with EU Directive 2011/7/EU on combating Late Payment in commercial Transactions transposed into national legislation as S.I. 580 of 2012 and amended by S.I. No. 281 of 2016.

6.31 Data Protection

"Data Protection Laws" means all applicable national and EU data protection laws, regulations and guidelines including but not limited to Regulation (EU) 2016/679 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (the "General Data Protection Regulation"), the Data Protection Act, 2018 and any guidelines and codes of practice issued by the Data Protection Commission or other supervisory authority for data protection in Ireland from time to time.

The Contracting Authority will be a Controller (where Controller has the meaning given under the Data Protection Laws) in respect of any Personal Data (where Personal Data has the meaning given under the Data Protection Laws) required to be provided by the Tenderer in response to this Request for Tender.

The Tenderer, as Controller in respect of any Personal Data provided by it in its Tender, is required to confirm by way of statement in the “Declarations” section of the accompanying Tender Response Document that all Data Subjects (where Data Subject has the meaning given under the Data Protection Laws) whose Personal Data is provided by the Tenderer have consented to the processing of such Personal Data by the Tenderer, the Contracting Authority, the Evaluation Team and the supplier of the eTenders website, for the purposes of the participation of the Tenderer in this Competition or that the Tenderer otherwise has a legal basis for providing such Personal Data to the Contracting Authority for the purposes of its participation in this Competition.

6.32 Changes in Legislation

As a condition of award, it shall be the sole responsibility of the tenderer (in the event of success in this competition) to fulfil the obligations under the Contract.

6.33 International Procurement Instrument-IPI

The Contracting Authority would refer Tenderers in particular to the provisions of Regulation (EU) 2022/1031 on the access of third country economic operators, goods and services to the Union’s public procurement and concession markets and procedures supporting negotiations on access of Union economic operators, goods and services to the public procurement and concession markets of third countries (International Procurement Instrument – IPI), and to their obligation to comply therewith. In particular, tenderers and candidates should note in Article 6 of Regulation (EU) 2022/1031, the obligations for a Contracting Authority in the context of a procurement procedure where the EU Commission has adopted an IPI measure.

6.34 Responsibility of Successful Party

As a condition of award, it shall be the successful tenderer’s sole responsibility to ensure they have taken account of all obligations under the Contract including factors which might arise based on the withdrawal of the United Kingdom from membership of the EU.
